MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

Dear Friends

THANK YOU FOR MINISTERING TO ME

You have always been a tower of strength to me throughout my ministry with you in Dunipace, more so these past few weeks, during which time the prayers, care, ongoing compassion and unending gestures of support, offered by yourselves helped me cope with the death of my dear mum.

I have in fact been overwhelmed by the kindness bestowed upon me and extend my deepest thanks to all concerned.

The members and friends of Dunipace Parish Church, the local community, and clergy, were all outstanding and managed to get the balance right between showering me with their care and yet giving me the space I needed to come to terms with such a major change in my life.

From the day and hour mum and myself arrived in Dunipace you made us feel very much at home. Throughout mum's illness members and friends of the congregation continued to ask after her and were always willing to help in whatever way they could. This meant a great deal to mum and me. For embracing us both in such a loving manner, I thank you.

Mum lived a full life. She was a woman of great faith and we were able to reflect that in the Service of Thanksgiving which was reverent, respectful and personal.

I shared an incredible rapport with my mum and have many memories to treasure. Mum was the first to say that she was “tired and done.” She helped us as a family accept that her time had come and so we have let her go in peace, knowing that a new chapter begins in our life, but knowing too, that she may be gone from sight but will be kept in our hearts forever.

The support we received from the congregation – especially on the day of the funeral – helped us as a family to do what needed to be done with dignity and with peace of heart and mind. For this I again thank you on behalf of Mrs Jeanie Wardlaw Gallacher’s Clan!

As I reflect upon the whole experience of “letting go” what I have learnt to treasure most is the reaffirmation that when “push comes to shove” or when the “chips are down” as a congregation we pull together all the more strongly and work hand in hand to help each other through the difficult times.

I have seen this same strength of congregational support surface in the midst of the proposed Presbytery Plan Consultation process we are going through.

As we look at where we have come from, what we are doing, and what shape the church of the future will have, we will need to let go of that which is “tired and done” but this we shall do always acknowledging the rich contribution it made to the life and work of the church.

We must then be prepared to embrace the new chapter that is unfolding in our church life too, with courage and with confidence, knowing that God who has brought us to where we are, will safely lead us to where we should be.

IN MEMORY AND IN LOVE

The death of a church member always has an impact on the life and work of the church. Down through the years we have bid “farewell” to many faithful members who have served the church in countless ways – giving of their time and talents in unbelievable ways. Without such dedicated and loyal service the Church would struggle to be the Church.

The whole community was saddened by the death of Mrs Margaret Hunter (Rita) as we knew and loved her. Rita died at the grand age of 95 and had lived every one of those years to the fullest, serving the church and wider community faithfully. She had been a Sunday School teacher in Larbert, an Elder and Clerk to the Board in Dunipace, along with our World Mission Rep who diligently corresponded with our Mission Partners overseas. This of course, is only the tip of the iceberg with regard to the many ways in which Rita gave of herself in service to the church and community.

As we mourn Rita's death and acknowledge the richness of her service, we pray for Robert and his family. Indeed, we hold all church members who mourn the death of a loved one very much in our prayers.

STEWARDSHIP

SEPTEMBER is our STEWARDSHIP MONTH

It's never easy to talk about money, more so in the church because folks often say, "All the church talks about IS money" For this reason people tend to get turned off rather than switched on when we dare to mention money. But surely the Church talks about more than money – we talk about MISSION – OUTREACH – DISCIPLESHIP – VISION - The Church, however, needs money to do all these things so we cannot avoid mentioning the "M" word. What makes it so much harder just now is the fact that all of us are struggling as a result of the economic climate. People have limited funds and greater demands are being placed on those limited funds. So we do not mention the "M" word lightly or in an attempt to rile people or make it even more difficult. We mention it because we must – good stewardship is at the heart of the gospel message

Thankfully in the Church – we rely upon peoples' TIME and TALENTS in order to undertake much of our work and witness BUT and here it is again – we need MONEY too!

All the church asks is that its members give a "fitting proportion" of their time, talents and money and review their giving on a regular basis. We leave the decision as to "how much you give" entirely to you.

What we can tell you is that here in Dunipace Church we need to raise over £60,000 each year just for the General Fund not to mention Property costs!

What we can also tell you is that with numbers declining and outreach increasing, the costs have to be met by fewer and fewer people

We can also tell you that the Church nationally is reducing the number of full time ministers by over 200 because it

cannot afford to keep them. In our own area we have to go down from five full time ministers to four!

We can also tell you that 65% of congregations do not meet the full costs of having a minister. Most pay what Edinburgh asks of them but these 65% of congregations are still being subsidised.

And finally we can tell you that the clergy themselves (who are often amongst the highest givers in a congregation) have not had a stipend increase for over two years, in a bid to help reduce the deficit in Ministry funds and ease some of the pressure on local congregations

In these DIFFICULT and DEMANDING times what can members do to help?

MEMBERS CAN....

1. Give a fitting proportion of their money on a regular basis to help the local congregation manage their budget
2. Make up for lost Sunday's – if you miss a week please remember the work of the church goes on
3. Think about what you give and consider if you can give that little bit more
4. Be realistic in your giving – today we hardly even get a loaf of bread for a pound – let alone heat the church.
5. Support your local churches STEWARDSHIP MONTH by putting an extra DONATION in the envelope provided
6. Consider GIFT AID – it's the easy way for people paying tax to increase what they give to the church
7. Pray for the work and witness of the local congregation and ask God to help them meet their financial obligations
8. Give willingly, cheerfully and gladly
9. Make a positive response and not be offended at the mention of the "M" word – "M" being MONEY!

PRAISE

“Oh the times they are a changing” The words from the old familiar song, ring true. These are difficult days, and “There’s no’ two doubts about it.” Economically, socially, politically, morally, culturally, ecclesiastically, in every way life is changing. This will either fill us with fear or give us the incentive we need to meet the challenges before us.

Within the life of the Church, much is changing, declining numbers, increasing financial demands and constant change in rules and regulations. Surely, though, we should not lose sight of the incredible ways in which we are continually serving the local community and beyond. Our numbers maybe declining but there is greater commitment and ongoing development in our outreach. If we could only put a value on the time and talents that people offer, we would discover just how rich we are in a unique sense.


