Message from your Minister God the Provider

Elisha replied to her, 'How can I help you? Tell me, what do you have in your house?'

'Your servant has nothing there at all', she said, 'except a little oil.' 2 Kings 4

Dear Friends,

I have fond memories of the time when I was a little girl growing up in a community where people looked after their neighbours and did what they could to help those who were in need. This worked because people trusted each other. Senior members of the community were not afraid of the youth. The young were not frightened by the frail in society. Neighbours looked out for each other, they were not competitive and did not envy that which others had because in the main they all had pretty much the same.

My mum would often say to David, Linda or myself, "Away over the road with this jug of soup and give it to Mrs so and so or Mr so and so." In other words to whichever neighbour was in need of a jug of soup or a loaf of bread or some milk or eggs. My mum was doing what she had learned from her own mum, namely, to cheerfully, willingly and freely, provide for those who were in need of help. My Granny Wardlaw was like an unpaid and probably unregistered "District Nurse" or "Home Help", yet she possessed all the knowledge and all the skill required to be of assistance to people in their time of need, such as providing an old remedy for an everyday ailment. "Little things" my Granny Wardlaw informed me, "often make the biggest difference in peoples lives." She was referring to a kindly word, a cheery smile, a friendly wave, a wee bunch of flowers or sweet treat, little things that let them know they were not forgotten but were kept in thought and prayer.

I like to think this willingness to be there for others and help them has not skipped a generation. I like to think I carry these genes of compassion and provision in my genetic make up too!

No doubt there will be times, many times, when I, when you, when we, fall short or fail to be there for others. We are, however, greatly comforted in knowing that God the great Provider will not fail us and will always meet our deepest needs.

Evidence of God's provision runs throughout the Bible, like a golden thread binding the pages of the Old and New Covenants together. One of my favourite stories is found in 2 Kings chapter 4, where a worried-looking woman came to see the prophet Elisha.

"Sir," she began, 'I am in real trouble...'

"I wonder how I can help you?' He murmured. Then God put a suggestion into Elisha's mind. "Have you anything at all left in the house?" he asked. "Just a little jar of olive oil - that's all,' she answered. "That will do," Elisha said.

Elisha instructed the woman to borrow as many empty jars as she could find. As she started to fill the jars, it seemed as if the supply of oil would never run out. "Go and sell the oil," commanded Elisha.

This story speaks not just about God being the great Provider, it speaks almost as loudly about the role we play too, namely that of TRUSTING in God. The woman's problem was solved. Her need was met. Her prayer was answered and, most importantly of all, her trust in God was honoured because she was prepared to do what God asked of her.

We ask and expect God to meet our needs, answer our prayers, fill our empty church pews, put coffers in our church purses, provide a new minister, solve our problems, lift our anxiety... and so God does according to His Will. But often our asking is half-hearted and our trust lukewarm.

When it comes to meeting our needs, we expect God to do what we ask of Him. The more important question, however, is this: In allowing God to meet our individual and corporate needs are we prepared to do what God is asking of us?

What is God asking of us?

God might well be asking us to let go of old wounds and niggling grudges. In order to provide what we need, God might well be asking us to surrender our control over a situation and hand it over to God in prayer. It might be that we need to speak openly and honestly to those who can assist us, knowing with confidence that they will not judge us but rather do everything they can to help. It might be that before God can provide for us, we need to demonstrate our complete trust in God and in those whom God sends to help us.

Perhaps this "little adaptation" of Joseph Scriven's famous hymn, helps drive the need for trust home.

"What a friend we have in Jesus, all our sins and grief to bear! What a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer O what peace we often forfeit, O what needless pain we bear All because we "lack the trust required" To carry everything to God in prayer!"

We fear and we fuel the anxiety of others

We worry ourselves sick and often let your guidance pass us by

Give us, O God, such trust in your power, and in your will to help us, that we take risks in your service, and most importantly of all, the leap of faith that allows us to surrender our will to your will, our way to your way, and our work and witness to your vision for this place and these your people you have called us to love, serve and trust in your precious name.

These things we pray, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord Amen
